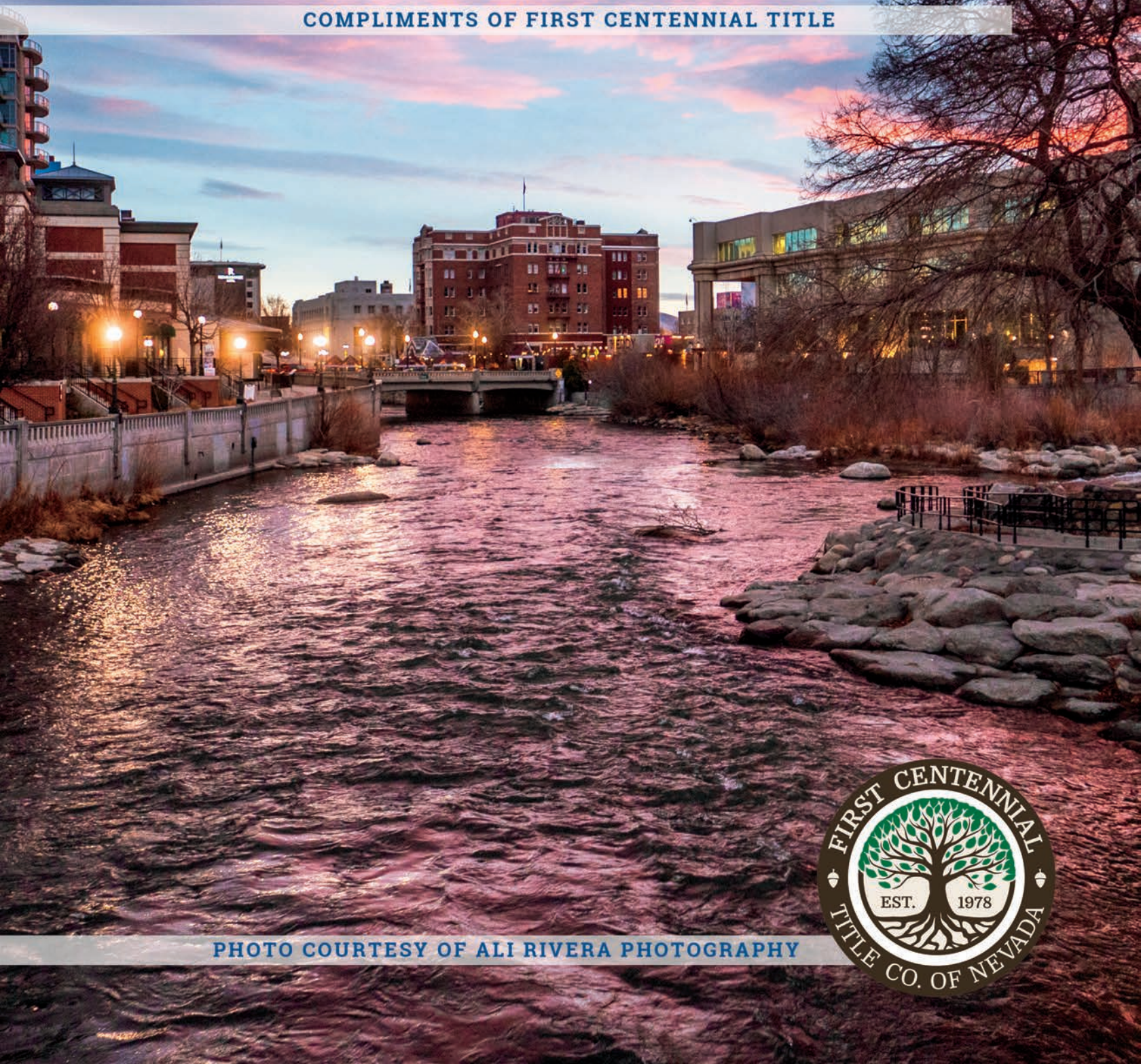

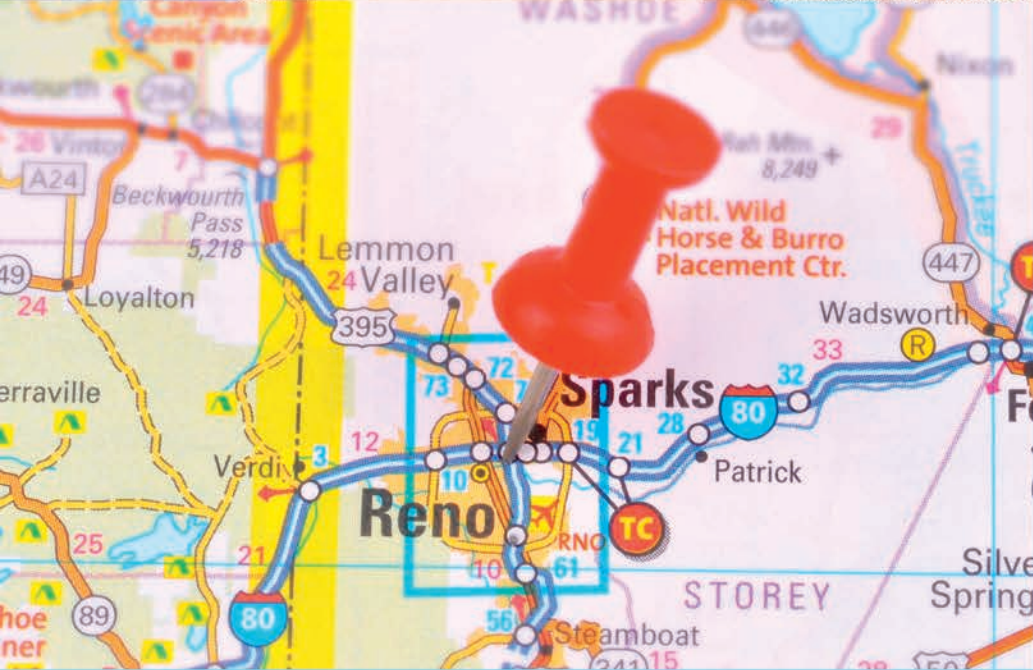

**Located in the majestic Sierra Nevada Mountains**, the breathtaking Reno-Sparks Lake Tahoe area is not your average destination. From the arts to the cultural splendor, from the casinos to its unprecedented natural surroundings, the Reno-Sparks area is rich in both tradition and fresh entertainment.

**Minutes away from world-famous Lake Tahoe**, the Reno-Sparks community is surrounded by natural beauty and limitless recreational opportunities. The Reno-Sparks Lake Tahoe region has over 18 world-class ski resorts, many just a short 45-minutes from downtown, and 40-plus golf courses. The area also boasts 60 gaming locations, the National Bowling Stadium, the National Automobile Museum, Rancho San Rafael Park's Arboretum and Wilbur D. May Great Basin Adventure, the historic boomtown of Virginia City, and world-class fishing, hiking, biking, and numerous other outdoor activities. **At 4,500 feet above sea level, the Reno-Sparks area offers four distinct seasons with few extremes.** Average temperatures range from winter lows in the 20's to summer highs in the 90's. Low humidity characterizes the area, making the cool days seem not so cold and the warm days not so hot. Rain is scarce, and snow is certain. Here the sun shines more than 300 days a year.

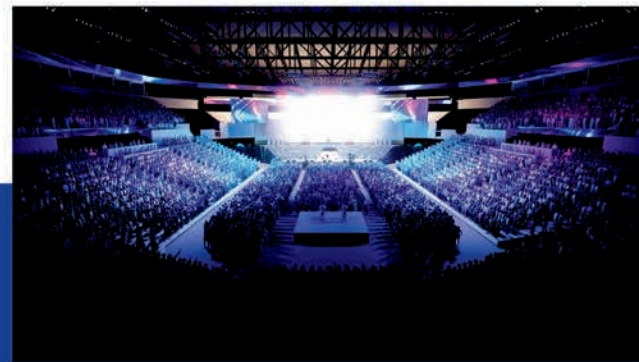
# RENO'S NEXT ERA OF ENTERTAINMENT

# LIBERTY DOGS

COMING SOON IN 2026

Liberty Dogs, the veteran-focused service-dog program being developed in the Damonte Ranch / South Reno area, continues to make significant progress as one of the cornerstone projects supporting the revitalization of Downtown Damonte.

Backed by the Dave & Cheryl Duffield Foundation, the 27-acre Liberty Dogs campus is now under active construction, with site work underway and vertical building phases anticipated to begin in 2026. Once complete, the campus will include:

- Full service-dog training facilities
- Kennels and veterinary services
- Whelping and breeding areas
- On-site housing for participating veterans

Veterans will take part in a two-week service-dog placement program, provided entirely at no cost.

Even ahead of the campus opening, Liberty Dogs has already launched meaningful programming in the region. The organization welcomed its first four Liberty Dog puppies into training in late 2024 and is actively offering a three-day Wellness & Education program to local veterans—strengthening outreach efforts and laying the groundwork for future service-dog placements.

Recent development updates confirm that Liberty Dogs remains on track for a Summer 2026 grand opening, with construction momentum renewed following the resolution of broader Downtown Damonte regulatory and environmental delays in 2025.

As progress continues, Liberty Dogs is quickly becoming one of the most impactful additions to the community—providing vital support to veterans, generating positive economic and nonprofit energy in South Reno, and serving as a flagship development within the Downtown Damonte vision.

Sparks is known as the premiere special events venue for all of Northern Nevada with attractions on the Victorian Square bringing thousands of visitors to annual events such as Hometown Farmer's Market, Hot August Nights, Best in the West Nugget Rib Cook Off and Hometown Christmas. 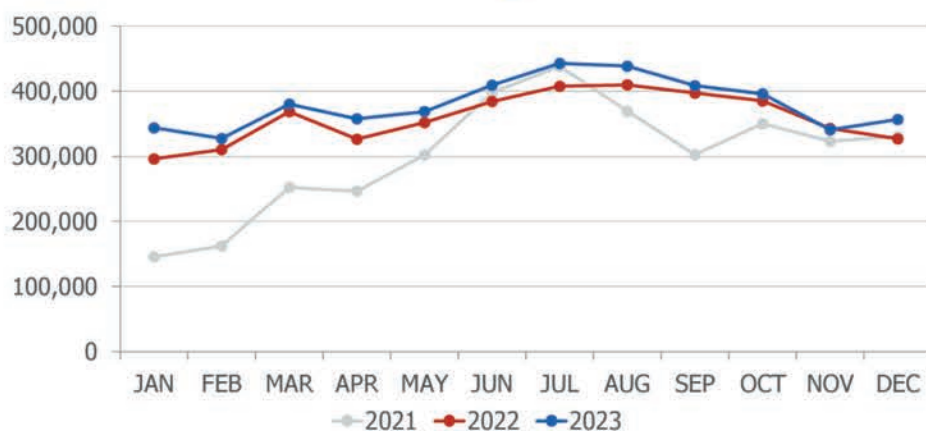

# RENO/SPARKS ECONOMY

The Reno-Sparks Economy is principally based in the trade and service sector, with approximately 65% of the work force employed in these occupations. Although gaming and other recreational activities represent a significant portion of the growing economy and assessed valuation, the City is experiencing a gradual diversification of its business base with the expansion of distribution, warehousing, and manufacturing facilities. Approximately 25% of the workforce is employed in the fields of construction, manufacturing, transportation, communications, public utilities, and finance related services.

The Reno-Sparks area is serviced by two major highways, the Union Pacific Railroad and a number of trucking and airline carriers. This makes it possible to ship from Reno to 80% of the 11 western states on a next-day basis.

Nevada has no corporate or personal income tax, and is a right-to-work state. These factors have contributed to the state's tremendous growth in the 1990's and into the 2000's.

In addition to the accomplishments of the Economic Development Authority of Western Nevada in bringing new business to Northern Nevada, the City of Reno Economic and Redevelopment Agency has begun both entertainment and housing projects for in the City's downtown sector.

Over thirty million dollars of City and one billion dollars in private/other public investment have been made in downtown Reno to modernize and beautify infrastructure and facilities. A maintenance district was established to ensure that the downtown area will remain clean and beautiful. The City also established a police district downtown to ensure a safer environment.

The Greater Reno-Sparks-Tahoe area is one of the fastest growing regions in the U.S. and is rated among the top metropolitan statistical areas in a recent Milken Institute report. The Economic Development Authority of Western Nevada's (EDAWN) mission is directed toward strengthening our community by attracting companies and in many cases, their corporate headquarters from diverse industry sectors. Our new economy is in part powered by a growing number of technology-related and advanced manufacturing companies to the region. # THE GREATER RENO-SPARKS AREA HAS SEEN SIGNIFICANT ECONOMIC ACTIVITY

EDAWN reports over 5,000 jobs created in the last year, attracting 25 new companies, and seeing a strong technology sector growth. Key stats include a record average wage of over \$64,000, 2,300 jobs created in 2022 with a record average wage of \$32.67/hour, and a healthy job market fueled by diversification across industries like manufacturing, technology, and logistics.



## Recent highlights and job growth

- Job creation: EDAWN assisted in creating 5,000+ jobs in the last year alone, with 2,263 new jobs added in 2022 from 27 new and expanded companies.
- Average wage: The average wage for new jobs is over \$64,000, with 2022 seeing a record average wage of \$32.67 per hour.
- New and expanded companies: In 2023, 21 companies relocated or expanded, adding 1,288 jobs. In 2022, 27 companies added jobs and 12 new headquarters were established.



## Economic and industry data

- Economic diversity: The economy is diversifying with technology, manufacturing, and logistics, distribution, and e-commerce being the leading sectors.
- Technology sector: This is the largest segment of companies, representing 41% in 2022. Major tech companies like Tesla, Google, and Apple have a presence in the region, and the area has attracted numerous startups.
- Skilled workforce: The region benefits from a skilled workforce, with a strong talent pipeline from institutions like the University of Nevada, Reno.



## Other economic indicators

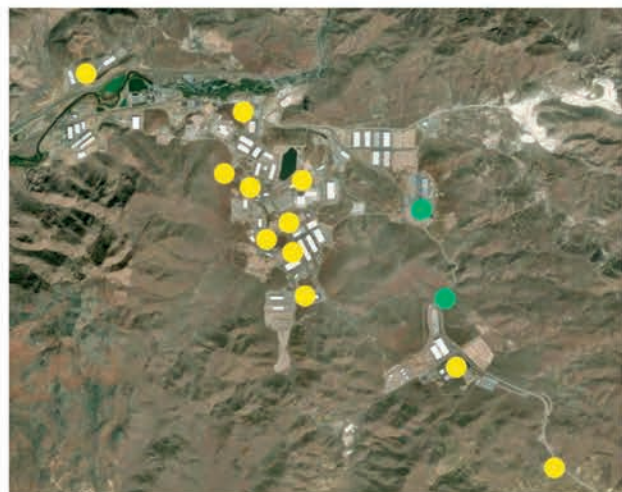
# TAHOE RENO INDUSTRIAL CENTER

Northern Nevada is experiencing an unprecedented wave of growth, with more than 13 million square feet of construction underway—roughly the equivalent of five Empire State Buildings. NV Energy reports that a dozen new data-center projects have requested nearly six gigawatts of future power capacity, positioning the Reno area to become one of the largest data-center markets in the world. This surge reflects the region’s rapid rise as a major technology hub, fueled by large-scale investments from leading companies such as Apple, Google, Microsoft, Tract, Switch, EdgeCore, Novva, Vantage, and PowerHouse.

These industry leaders in AI, cloud computing, and next-generation technologies are developing multi-billion-dollar campuses across the Tahoe-Reno Industrial Center and the Reno–Sparks area. Their investments are driving significant job creation, strengthening digital infrastructure, and diversifying the local economy—fueling Northern Nevada’s position as an attractive and connected place for new residents and businesses alike.





# SWITCH TAHOE RENO

The world's largest, most advanced data center campus is now located in Reno/Sparks' backyard. The first building in Switch's Citadel Campus officially opened at the Tahoe Reno Industrial Center in late February of 2017. It is known as "Tahoe Reno 1," the 130-megawatt facility is one of several data center buildings planned for the project. The Citadel Campus is Switch's response to the increasing demand for internet-connected people, services and devices. It is designed to be the world's largest data center campus built on the same designs as the campus in Las Vegas. Before Tahoe Reno 1 came about, the title of the largest single data center building belonged to the Lakeside Technology Center located in Chicago.

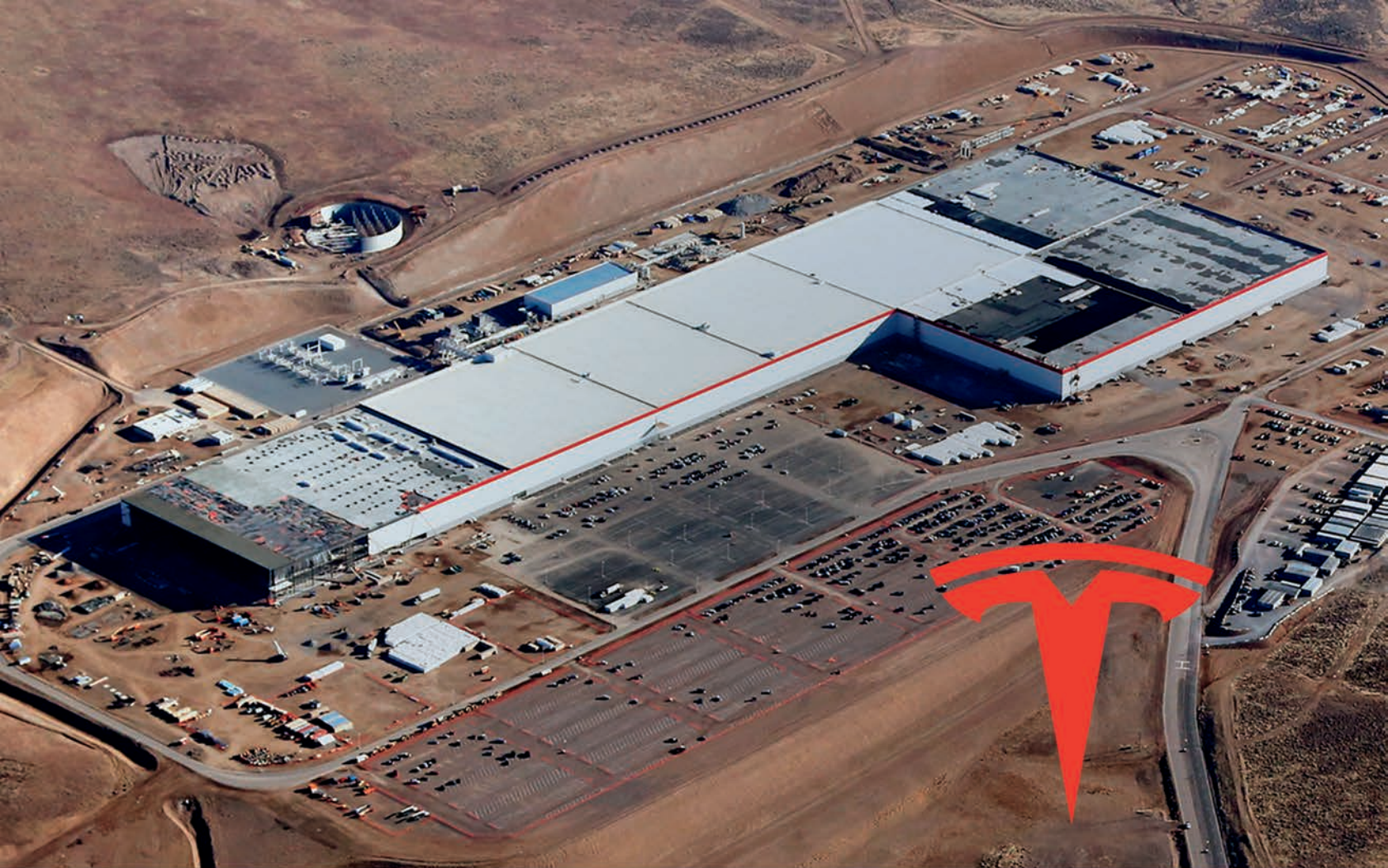


## GOOGLE IN NORTHERN NEVADA

Google's Northern Nevada facility is shaping up to be a large undertaking as construction picks up at the 1,210-acre site inside Tahoe Reno Industrial Center. There is plenty of construction activity at the site on USA Parkway just a few miles south of the Switch Citadel data center campus and Tesla Gigafactory in Storey County. The frame of a two-story structure surrounded by cranes and other construction equipment can be seen at the site, which Google bought for \$29.1 million in April 2017. Google has yet to provide specific details about the facility, which is expected to be a data center.

Google bought the facility as part of a \$13 billion investment that the company was making across the United States, including in Nevada. At the time, CEO Sundar Pichai indicated that Google will be making major expansions in 14 states. "These new investments will give us the capacity to hire tens of thousands of employees, and enable the creation of more than 10,000 new construction jobs in Nebraska, Nevada, Ohio, Texas, Oklahoma, South Carolina and Virginia," Pichai wrote in Google's official blog. "With this new investment, Google will now have a home in 24 total states, including data centers in 13 communities."

# TESLA BATTERY GIGAFACTORY

Tesla broke ground on the Gigafactory in June 2014 outside Sparks, Nevada. The name Gigafactory comes from the word 'Giga,' the unit of measurement representing "billions." The Gigafactory is being built in phases so that Tesla can begin manufacturing immediately inside the finished sections and continue to expand thereafter. Already, the current structure has a footprint of more than 1.9 million square feet, which houses more than 4.9 million square feet of operational space across several floors. Still, the Gigafactory is about 30 percent done. Once complete, Tesla expects the Gigafactory to be the biggest building in the world – and entirely powered by renewable energy sources. Designed to be a net zero energy factory upon completion, the facility will be primarily powered by solar, and installation is already underway.

In mid-2018, battery production at Gigafactory 1 reached an annualized rate of roughly 20 GWh, making it the highest-volume battery plant in the world. Tesla currently produces more batteries in terms of kWh than all other carmakers combined. With the Gigafactory ramping up production, Tesla's cost of battery cells will significantly decline through economies of scale, innovative manufacturing, reduction of waste, and the simple optimization of locating most manufacturing processes under one roof. By reducing the cost of batteries, Tesla can make products available to more and more people, allowing us to make the biggest possible impact on transitioning the world to sustainable energy.

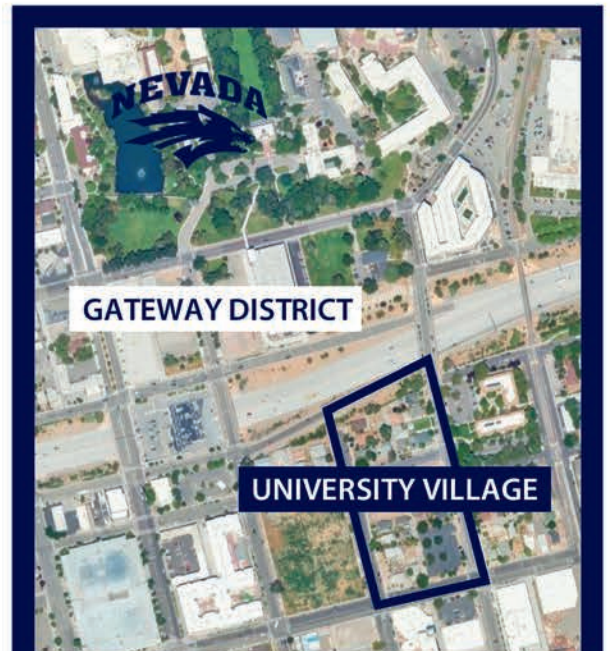

## NEW SCHOOLS & EXPANSIONS

Since voters approved the 2016 capital funding initiative, the Washoe County School District has invested nearly \$1 billion in building and upgrading schools to support the region's rapid growth.

The district has opened multiple new schools across Reno, Sparks, and surrounding communities, including several new middle and elementary schools between 2019 and 2023, plus a brand-new Procter R. Hug High School campus and the Debbie Smith Career and Technical Education Academy. Major upgrades and rebuilds—such as at Damonte Ranch, O'Brien, and Swope Middle Schools—have also expanded capacity and improved facilities.

Looking ahead, future school construction will continue as population growth requires, with the district partnering closely with local governments and planners to forecast enrollment and ensure schools keep pace with Northern Nevada's development.

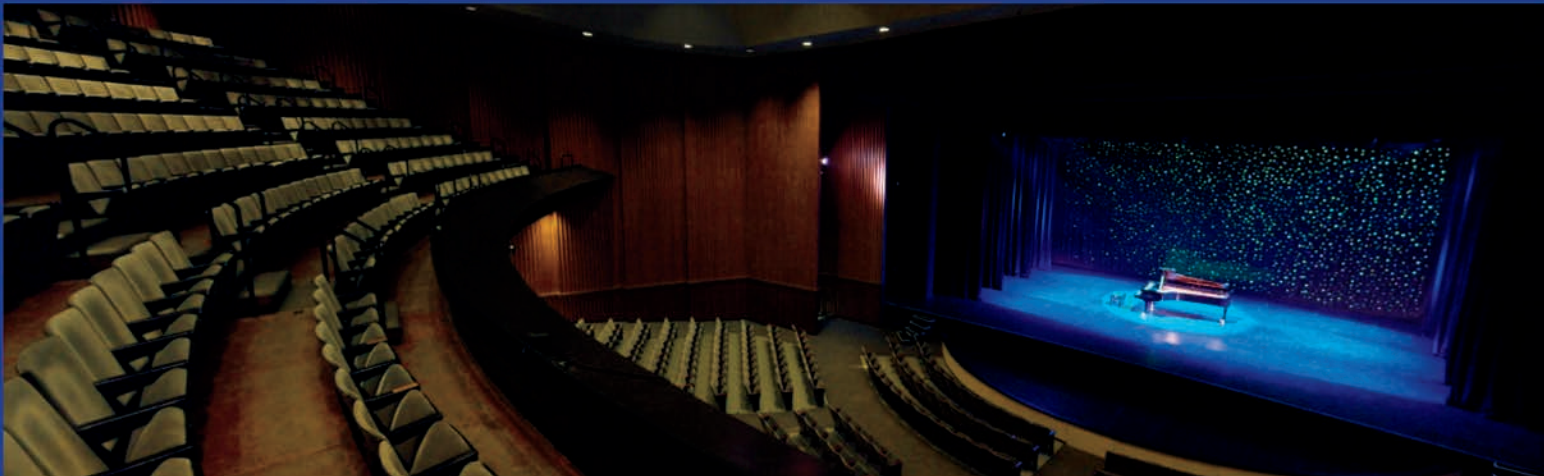

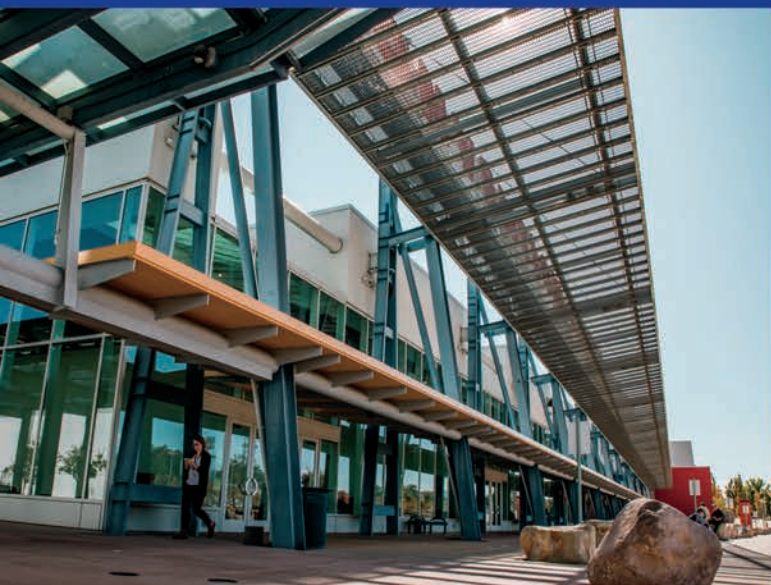

# RENO SPARKS CONVENTION CENTER

Owned and operated by the RSCVA, the Reno-Sparks Convention Center underwent a major renovation and expansion in 2002, and continues to receive upgrades and improvements to its public spaces and technology offerings. # RENO ACES

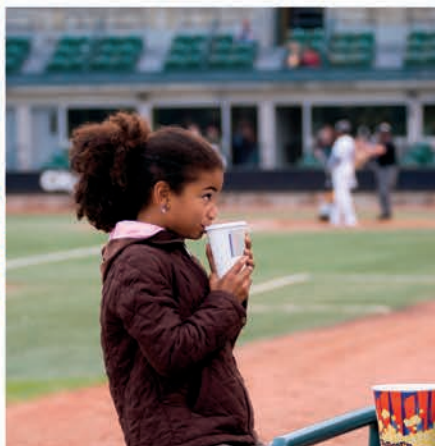

## **Truckee River Walk**

Features native Nevada wildlife reliefs and unique fountains year-round. The River walk is a perfect place to take a leisurely stroll and take in the beauty that surrounds downtown Reno.

## **Sand Mountain**

Sand Mountain is a dune over 328 feet high located about 2 hours from Reno. It is popular with camping and off-road vehicle enthusiasts.

## **Sparks Marina**

This 77-acre lake with year round picnicking, fishing, jogging trails and children's playground. A family beach, volleyball courts and a dog park.

## **Rancho San Rafael**

The Wilbur D. May Arboretum and Botanical Garden ~ one of the most beautiful and diverse gardens in Nevada. Twelve acres covered with groves of trees, wetland habitats, outdoor courtyards and secluded gardens.

## **Bartley Ranch Regional & Robert Z. Hawkins Amphitheater**

Consisting of 56 acres of scenic pasture, walking trails, a regulation size horse arena and warm-up area, the Western Heritage Interpretive Center and the Old Huffaker School.

## **Galena Creek Recreation Area**

The center includes a weather station, exhibits, gift shop and a book store. A half-mile paved nature trail is located just outside the Visitor Center along with access to the Jones-Whites Creek Loop Trail and the Mt. Rose Wilderness. The Recreation Area has individual picnic areas and one large group picnic area and a new trailhead.

## **Lazy 5 Regional Park**

This park includes a 2,400 sq. ft. community center with outdoor patio and barbecue area, a water play park, two playgrounds, volleyball courts, horseshoe pits and two multi-use athletic fields.

## **Bowers Mansion Park**

The Stately Bowers mansion is located in the center of the park and offers a rare glimpse into Nevadan life in the 1860's. The park also includes an outdoor swimming pool, playground, group and individual picnic areas.

## **Golden Eagle Regional Park & Sports Complex**

This large outdoor artificial turf sports complex in Sparks has 1.4 million square feet of turf which currently makes it the largest single installation artificial turf project in North America.
